STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of scallops in West Penobscot
Bay from April first to October first of each year.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy any
2 scallop or scallops in the waters of Penobscot Bay or its trib-
3 utaries, from April first to October first of each year, west
4 of a line drawn from Cape Rosier to the north point of
5 North Haven, and following the northwest shore of said
6 North Haven to its southwest point, commonly called Crab-
7 tree's Point, and thence to the west point of Matinicus and
8 north of a line drawn from said west point of Matinicus to
9 White Head Light.

Sect. 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions
2 of the foregoing section shall be punished by a fine of one
3 dollar for each scallop so taken, caught, killed or destroyed.
4 Trial justices and judges of police and municipal courts
5 shall have jurisdiction of all offences under this act. Said
6 fines shall be collected by action of debt.
