STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Bog brook, so-called, and Deer,
or Bog pond, so-called, in the township of Lowelltown, in
Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take,
2 catch or kill any fish less than eight inches in length in Bog
3 brook, so-called, or in Deer, or Bog pond, so-called, in the
4 township of Lowelltown, in Franklin county.

It shall be unlawful for any one person in any one day to
6 take, catch or kill more than five pounds of fish in all in any
7 of these waters.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall
9 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general
10 law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catching of

11 trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-
4 diction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and
5 all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any viola-
6 tion of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiv-
7 ing the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and
8 license fees for the protection of birds and game.
