STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Parker pond, so-called, and tributaries, in the towns of Mount Vernon, Vienna and Fayette, in Kennebec County, and in the town of Chesterville, in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Parker pond, so-called, or
3 in any of its tributaries, in the towns of Mount Vernon,
4 Vienna and Fayette, in Kennebec county, and in the town
5 of Chesterville, in Franklin county, except that it shall be
6 lawful to take smelts and suckers, as provided in the gen-
7 eral law of the State, in the Bacheller Mill stream, so-called,
8 and to take suckers, as provided in the general law, in the
9 brooks flowing into said pond.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall
11 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general
12 law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catching trout
13 and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-
3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts,
5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any viola-
6 tion of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiv-
7 ing the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines
8 and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
