STATE OF MAINE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of fish in certain waters in Somerset County and in the northern part of Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, 2 catch or kill or have in possession more than ten pounds 3 of landlocked salmon, trout or togue in all in any one day 4 during the open season on the same in any of the following 5 named waters in Somerset county and in Franklin county, 6 to wit: In any of the brooks, streams, rivers, ponds or 7 lakes in townships one, two, three and four, Range 5, Som- 8 erset county; townships one, two, three, four and five, Range 9 6, Somerset county; townships two, three, four, five and 10 six, Range 7, Somerset county, all in the B. K. P., W. K. 11 R., Somerset county; townships two, three, four (Jackman),

12 five and six, Range 1, Somerset county; townships two,
13 three, four (Moose River), five and six, Range 2, Somer-
14 set county; townships two, three, four and five, Range 3,
15 Somerset county; townships three and four, Range 4, Som-
16 erset county; townships three and four, Range 5, Somer-
17 set county, all N. B. K. P., Somerset county; township one,
18 Range 6, Franklin county; townships one and two, Range
19 7, Franklin county; townships one and two, Range 8, Frank-
20 lin county; township one, Range 9, Franklin county, all
21 W. B. K. P., Franklin county.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in
3 the general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and
4 catching landlocked salmon, trout and togue.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this chapter, municipal
2 and police courts and trial justices within their respective
3 counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts, and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any violation
6 of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving
7 the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and
8 license fees for the protection of birds and game.
