STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Rome.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty dollars be and hereby
2 is appropriated for the purpose of reimbursing the town
3 of Rome for money paid by said town for tuition of a pupil
4 at the Maine Wesleyan Seminary, same being one-half the
5 amount actually paid by said town.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Rome paid to Maine Wesleyan Seminary forty dollars on account of tuition of Harry Burgess, and was entitled to be reimbursed one-half that amount, but through an oversight, same was not collected from the State.
