STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT authorizing and empowering George F. L'Abbee, of Eagle Lake Plantation, County of Aroostook, to erect and maintain piers, piles and booms in the Fish River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. George F. L'Abbee, his heirs and assigns, are
2 hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect and main3 tain piers, piles and booms in the Fish river, commencing
4 at a point on the westerly side of said river eight hundred
5 yards below the mouth of Wallagrass river and extending
6 down the westerly side of said Fish river to a cedar post
7 where the said George F. L'Abbee's mill is now erected.

Sect. 2. Said piers and booms shall be so constructed that

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2 logs, pulp wood and other lumber shall not be impeded or
3 delayed in its passage down said river, and expense of such
4 delay, if any, shall be paid by said L'Abbee.

Sect. 3. Said booms and piers shall also be so constructed 2 that if logs, lumber or other floatable material not owned 3 by said L'Abbee, be found within said booms, they shall 4 upon notice in writing be turned out of said booms at said 5 L'Abbee's expense.

Sect. 4. In the event of the erection of dams on Fish 2 river by the Fish River Improvement Company, or its as-3 signs, and said piers, piles and booms are rendered useless 4 by reason of flowage or from other causes, the said L'Abbee, 5 his heirs or assigns, shall be entitled to no damages for any 6 interference with the usefulness of said piers, piles and 7 booms by the Fish River Improvement Company or its 8 assigns.
