STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Millinocket.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred forty-two dollars and 2 ninety cents be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of 3 reimbursing the town of Millinocket for money paid on ac-4 count of Joseph McGlone, a State pauper.

Be it further Resolved, That the sum of twenty-three dol-6 lars and sixty-five cents be and is hereby appropriated for the 7 purpose of reimbursing the town of Millinocket for money 8 paid on account of Alfred Cyr, a State pauper.

Be it further Resolved, That the sum of twenty-eight dol-10 lars be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of reim-11 bursing the town of Millinocket for money paid on account 12 of Samuel Sambles, a State pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Joseph McGlone, Alfred Cyr and Samuel Sambles were woodsmen employed in the lumber region on the West Branch of the Penobscot River north of Millinocket. Becoming ill the town of Millinocket was called upon to care for them. These men were from the Province of New Brunswick, had never acquired a residence in the State of Maine and are now in parts unknown, so that it was impossible to obtain affidavits from them or from parties who knew them setting forth this fact.
