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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

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AN ACT to incorporate the Town of Portage Lake.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Township number thirteen in the sixth range  
2 of townships, west from the east line of the State of Maine,  
3 heretofore known as Portage Lake Plantation, is hereby  
4 incorporated as a town under the name of Portage Lake;  
5 and the inhabitants thereof are hereby invested with all the  
6 powers and privileges and subject to the duties and liabilities  
7 incident to other towns in this State.

Sect. 2. The collectors of the plantation of Portage Lake  
2 shall have power to finish the collection of all taxes which  
3 shall have been committed to them for collection prior to  
4 the passage of this act, and to settle with and pay the same

5 to the treasurer of the town of Portage Lake; and the sev-  
6 eral officers of said plantation are empowered to perform  
7 all the duties of town officers in the town created by this  
8 act, until their successors shall have been legally chosen  
9 and qualified as town officers of the town of Portage Lake  
10 under this act.

Sect. 3. Any justice of the peace may call the first meet-  
2 ing of the town of Portage Lake by posting a warrant  
3 therefor, stating the objects of said meeting, in three pub-  
4 lic and conspicuous places in said town, at least seven days  
5 before the time of holding said meeting.

Sect. 4. All property now belonging to Portage Lake  
2 plantation shall belong to, and the title thereof is hereby  
3 vested in the town of Portage Lake.

Sect. 5. The persons hereafter becoming chargeable as  
2 paupers within the limits of said town shall be chargeable  
3 to said town of Portage Lake, excepting those who are now  
4 State paupers.
