### STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of Robert Palmer of Moro in the County of Aroostook.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum 2 of twenty-four dollars to reimburse Robert Palmer of Moro 3 in the County of Aroostook for wood delivered to State pau-4 pers.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

During the month of December, 1907, Robert Palmer hauled from his own wood-lot what was estimated at 60 face cords of wood for State paupers. This wood was delivered in the log and without rendering any bill Mr. Palmer took his team and went into the woods hauling logs, and did not render his bill until some months afterwards. Payment has been held up by technicality about the date of the bill rendered. The selectmen state that Mr. Palmer delivered the wood and should have his pay for it, but seem unable to get the money through the regular channels.
