STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to create a Recorder of the Westbrook Municipal
Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The governor by and with the consent of the
2 council shall appoint a recorder for the municipal court for
3 the city of Westbrook, who shall be a resident of West-
4 brook and hold office for the term of four years.

In case of the absence of the judge from the court room
6 or when the judge shall be interested as party or attorney
7 or when the judge shall be sick or away or when the office
8 of judge shall have become vacant; the recorder shall have
9 and exercise all the powers of the judge.

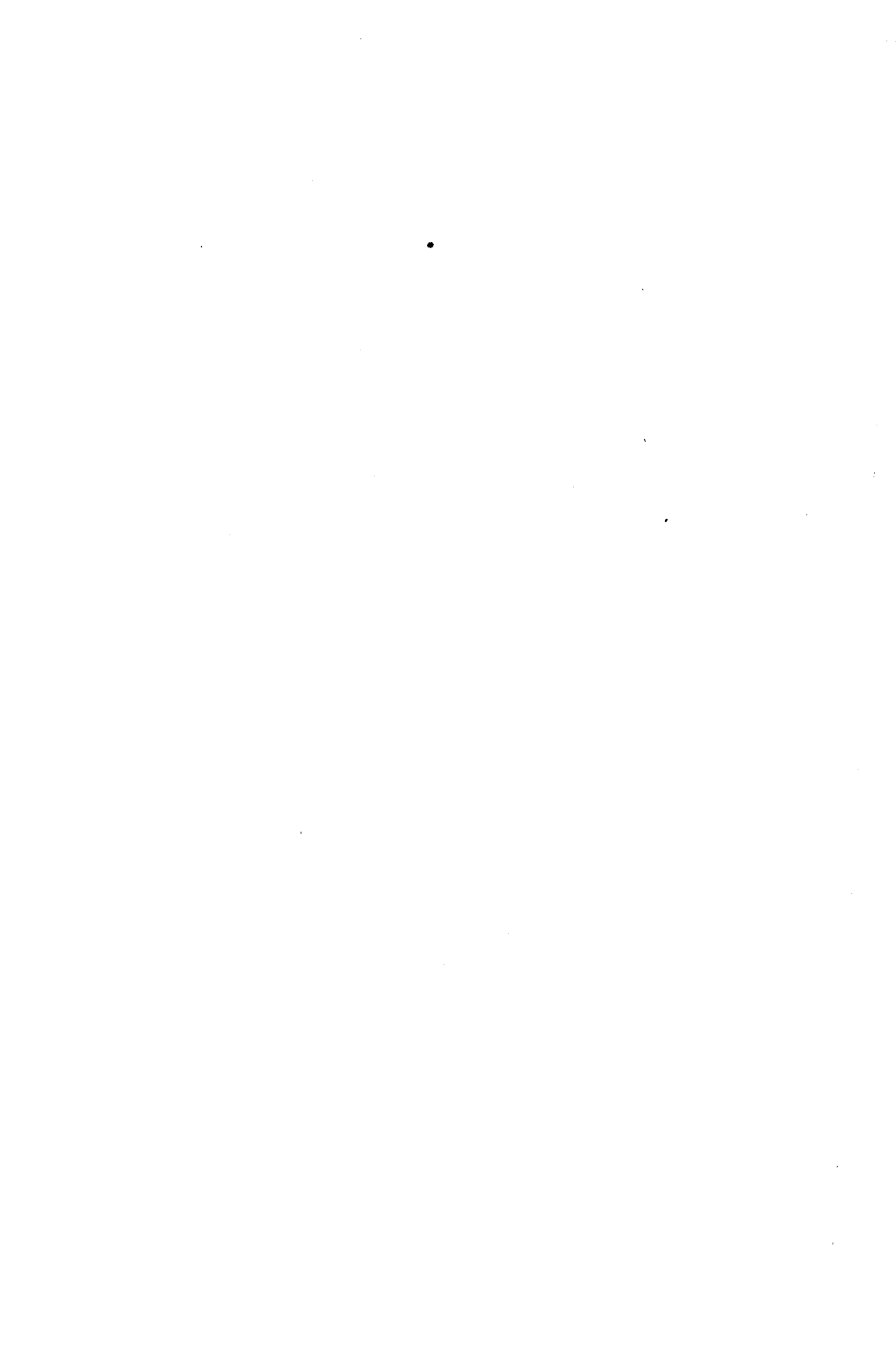
Such recorder shall receive an annual salary of two hun-

11 dred dollars, in full for all services as such recorder, which
12 salary shall be paid to him in quarterly payments from the
13 county treasury of the county of Cumberland.

Sect. 2. Section eleven of chapter one hundred and nine-
2 teen of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred
3 and three, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

‘Sect. 11. The judge of said court shall receive a salary
5 of one thousand dollars per year, to be paid to him in quar-
6 terly payments from the county treasury of the county of
7 Cumberland, which shall be in full for all his services as
8 judge. All blanks, civil and criminal dockets and record
9 books required by said court shall be furnished by the coun-
10 ty of Cumberland.’

Sect. 3. Chapter three hundred and thirty-six of the Pri-
2 vate and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, en-
3 titled “An Act creating the office of Probation Officer for
4 the City of Westbrook,” is hereby repealed.
