STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Indian River stream, so-called, in the towns of Jonesport, Addison and Columbia Falls, in the county of Washington.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
- 2 kill at any time any kind of fish in Indian River stream, so-
- 3 called, which stream is situated in the towns of Jonesboro,
- 4 Addison and Columbia Falls, in the County of Washington,
- 5 except during the months of April, May, June and July of
- 6 each year, during which months it shall be lawful to fish
- 7 for and catch fish in said stream in accordance with the gen-
- 8 eral law of the State, for a period of three years from the
- 9 time this act takes effect.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall 11 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general 12 law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catching trout 13 and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun3 ties shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with the 4 supreme judicial and superior courts, and all fines, forfeitures 5 and penalties received for any violation of this act shall be 6 paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the 7 State treasurer, and credited to fines and license fees for the 8 protection of birds and game.
