
RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Rangeley.

Resolved, That the sum of fourteen dollars and forty-one 2 cents be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of re-3 imbursing the town of Rangeley for money paid on account

4 of Mary Bubier, a State pauper.

Be it further resolved that the sum of fifty-nine dollars and 6 twenty-nine cents be and is hereby appropriated for the pur7 pose of reimbursing the town of Rangeley, for money paid 8 on account of Wm. Thomas, a State pauper.

Be it further resolved, that the sum of one hundred and 10 eighty-two dollars seventy-five cents be and is hereby appro-11 priated for the purpose of reimbursing the town of Range-12 ley, for money paid on account of John Donovan and family, 13 as State paupers.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mary Bubier and Wm. Thomas of Dallas Plantation have been helped by the State for more than ten years, the last payments were made August, 1907, which settled their accounts to July of that year.

John Donovan has worked in various lumber camps in Maine for five or six years. He has no home or family, and owing to an accident in the woods, "while located at Cupsuptic," resulting in breaking his hip and other serious injuries, he was taken care of, and bills paid by the town of Rangeley to the amount of \$182.75. He had no pauper settlement in Maine.
