STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of a screen at the outlet of Messalonskee lake, or Snow pond, so-called, in Kennebec county.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nine
3 for the purpose of screening Messalonskee lake, or Snow
4 pond, so-called, in Kennebec county, to be expended under
5 the direction of the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and
6 Game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, as
7 found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the
8 citizens of Kennebec county, and paid into the treasurer of
9 State for this purpose.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be
11 available until the town of Oakland shall have, in legal

12 town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said
13 town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to
14 assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all
15 times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the
16 same will not become clogged and prevent the free running
17 of the water through same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This same amount was appropriated for this purpose two years ago, but on account of the parties interested being unable to make the necessary arrangements for erecting this screen during the time this appropriation was available, the appropriation lapsed—none of it was expended, and this resolve is merely a re-appropriation of the same amount the last Legislature appropriated for this purpose.
