STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to open the lakes and ponds in Kennebec county to
ice fishing one day in a week.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. During the months of February and March
2 of each year, it shall be lawful to fish through the ice and
3 catch fish, in accordance with the public laws of the State,
4 from sunrise in the morning until sunset at night, on
5 Wednesday of each week, in all the lakes and ponds in Ken-
6 nebec county except Jimmy, Sand, Buker, Long, Purgatory
7 and Little Purgatory ponds, in the town of Litchfield,
8 Crotched pond, sometimes called Echo lake, in Readfield,
9 Mt. Vernon and Fayette, Flying pond, in Vienna, and Lilly
10 pond, in Sidney, in which named ponds it shall be unlaw-

ful to fish through the ice at any time for any kind of fish,
under the same penalty as is now provided by law for the
illegal fishing for and catching of trout and land-locked sal-
mon.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for or catch any kind
of fish from the stone bridge leading from near the electric
railroad track to Island Park, sometimes called Hersey's Is-
land, in Lake Cobbosseecontee, in the town of Winthrop,
or in the bay westward of said bridge and island, under the
same penalty provided in the general law for the illegal
fishing for trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts, whether public or
private and special, inconsistent with this act, are hereby
repealed.
