STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of F. H. Hoar, special messenger to the Speaker of the House.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated to be

- 2 paid F. H. Hoar, special messenger to the Speaker of the
- 3 House, appointed under an order passed by the House on
- 4 January six, nineteen hundred and nine, the sum of four
- 5 hundred dollars for services, and thirty-five dollars for
- 6 mileage, for attendance on this session of the legislature,
- 7 and that the said office be and hereby is abolished, to take
- 8 effect on the adjournment sine die of this legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The House, by an order passed on January six, nineteen hundred and nine, created the office of special messenger to the Speaker, and on March fourth, referred to the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs a resolve providing for the payment of his services and mileage. The resolve herewith submitted carries the amount indicated in the resolve referred to the committee. From evidence presented to the committee it is of opinion that the office is unnecessary and should not be continued beyond the present session of the legislature. It therefore recommends that it be abolished.
