IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 264 of the Private and Special Laws of 1905 relating to fishing in Thompson pond.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 264 of the Private and Special Laws 2 of 1905 is hereby amended by striking out all of said chapter 3 and substituting therefor the following:

'Section 1. There shall be an annual close time on Thomp-5 son pond, situated in the counties of Oxford, Cumberland 6 and Androscoggin, from September first to January first of 7 the following year, during which time it shall be unlawful to 8 take, catch or kill any kind of fish except black bass. Whogever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be sub-10 ject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law

11 of the State for the illegal fishing for and catching of trout 12 and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions arising under this act, muni2 cipal and police courts and trial justices, within their re3 spective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and
4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and su5 perior courts, and all fines, penalties and forfeitures re6 ceived by any person for any violation of this act, shall be
7 paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the State
8 Treasurer, to be credited to fines and license fees for the pro9 tection of birds and game.
