STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Addison.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars for the support of bridges in the
3 town of Addison for the year nineteen hundred and nine,
4 and five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
5 ten.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Addison has a population of about nine hundred and fifty, and a valuation of one hundred and eighty-three thousand dollars, and a debt of twelve hundred dollars.

The town of Addison has 13 bridges; one is 550 feet in length with a draw, which costs from \$50 to \$60 a year to tend; one, 200 feet; two 100 feet in length, one 175 feet, and the others from 40 to 150 feet in length. Two of these bridges must be repaired at once.
