STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the towns of Enfield and Howland.

Resolved, That the sum of seven hundred dollars be
2 and hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the towns
3 of Enfield and Howland to be expended under the direction
4 of the road commissioners of said towns for the purpose of
5 repairing the bridge across the Penobscot River.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Enfield has a population of about one thousand, valuation of two hundred twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$228,000), tax rate twenty-four mills, a debt of one thousand dollars. This town has eight bridges to maintain.

The town of Howland has a population of five hundred nineteen, valuation two hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$280,000), tax rate twenty-two mills, a debt of \$12,000, with sixteen bridges to maintain.
