STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prevent the desecration of the 30th day of May,
commonly known as Memorial Day, and providing penalty
for violation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hold, give or carry on
2 any carnival, circus, circus parade, ball game, horse racing
3 or any other sporting entertainment in public on the 30th
4 day of May, commonly known as Memorial day.

Sect. 2. No city or town in the State of Maine shall au-
2 thorize, license or permit any of the entertainments men-
3 tioned in section one of this act.

Sect. 3. Any person violating the terms of this act shall,
2 upon conviction, be fined not less than ten dollars nor more
3 than two hundred dollars for each offense.
