IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 38 of chapter 28, relating to Buildings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section thirty-eight of chapter twenty-eight of 2 the Revised Statutes is amended by striking out said section 3 thirty-eight and by substituting in place thereof the follow-4 ing:

'Section 38. Every public house where guests are lodged, 6 and every building in which any trade, manufacture or busi-7 ness is carried on, requiring the presence of workmen above 8 the first story, and all rooms used for public assembly or 9 amusement, and all tenement houses three stories in height 10 where only one stairway of means of egress from the upper

stories of the building is provided, and all tenement houses of four or more stories in height, intended to be occupied by families, boarders or lodgers, above the third story, and all school houses two stories or more in height, shall at all times be provided with proper egresses or other means of escape from fire sufficient for the use of all persons accommodated, assembled, employed, lodged or resident therein. These egresses and means of escape shall be kept unobstructed, in good repair and ready for use the sufficiency thereof to be determined as provided in the following section.'
