AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section one of chapter 59 of the Public Laws of 1905, relating to fees of constables in serving venires.

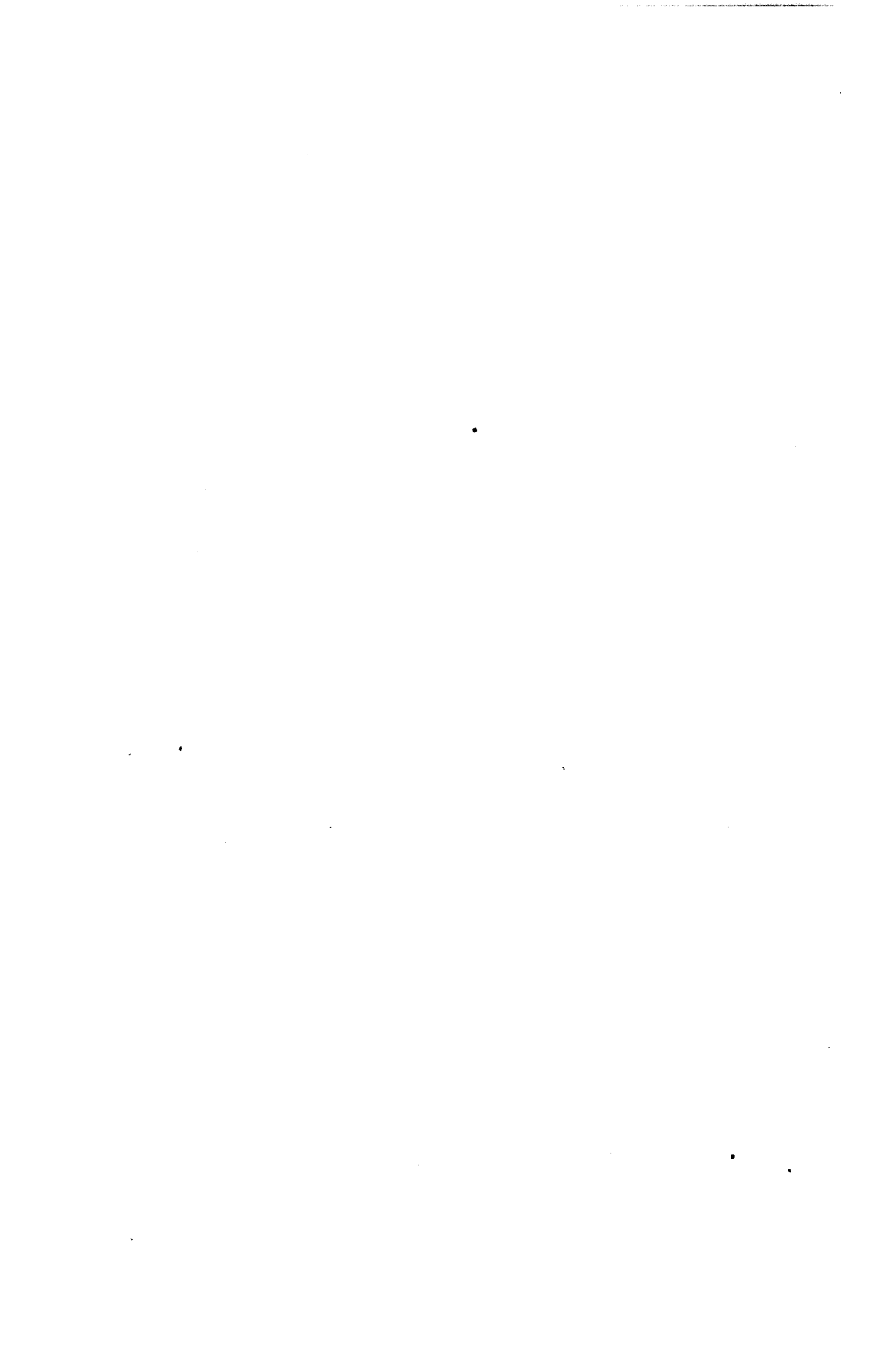

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section eight of chapter one hundred and 2 seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 3 one of chapter fifty-nine of the Public Laws of 1905, is 4 hereby amended by inserting after the word "for" in the 5 second line, the word 'actual'; and inserting in the third 6 line after the word "way," the words 'in posting and de- 7 livering the notices mentioned in section nine of chapter

8 one hundred and eight, and in notifying the juror or jurors  
9 drawn, as provided in section fourteen of said chapter,' so  
10 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. The fees of constables for the service and return  
12 of each venire, one dollar and fifty cents, and for actual  
13 travel six cents a mile each way in posting and delivering  
14 the notices mentioned in section nine of chapter one hun-  
15 dred and seventeen; and in notifying the juror or jurors  
16 draw as provided in section fourteen of said chapter, to be  
17 paid out of the county treasury; and for services which may  
18 be performed either by a deputy sheriff or a constable, the  
19 constable is allowed the same fees as a deputy sheriff,  
20 unless otherwise provided.'
