STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-four of chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes relating to the taking of smelts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section forty-four of chapter forty-one of the
Revised Statutes, as amended by chapters twenty, thirty and
ninety-one of the Public Laws of 1905; and as further
amended by chapters twelve, thirty-five and one hundred
twenty-three of the Public Laws of 1907 is hereby further
amended by adding in the eleventh line after the word
"greater" the words and weirs with catch pounds covered
with net which are erected and used for the catching of
herring so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 44. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in 12 tidal waters, except by hook and line, between the first days 13 of April and October, under a penalty of not less than ten, 14 nor more than thirty dollars for each offense, and a further 15 penalty of twenty cents for each smelt so taken, and all weirs 16 for the capture of smelts shall be open and so remain, and all 17 nets used in the smelt and tomcod fishery shall be taken from 18 the water on or before said first day of April, under a penalty 19 of not less than twenty, nor more than fifty dollars, and a 20 further fine of five dollars for each day that any such weir or 21 net remains in violation of the law. But weirs with catch 22 pounds covered with nets, the meshes of which are one inch 23 square in the clear, or greater, and weirs with catch pounds 24 covered with net which are erected and used for the catching 25 of herring, are not subject to this section. But no smelts 26 caught in such weirs after the first day of April, shall be sold 27 or offered for sale in this State nor shall smelts caught in any 28 manner between the first day of April and the first day of 29 October following be offered for sale, sold or shipped from 30 the State under a penalty of twenty-five dollars for each of-31 fense; provided, however, that dip nets may be used between 32 the first day of April and the first day of May, and all smelts 33 caught by dip nets between said days may be lawfully offered 34 for sale and sold in this State; provided, further, that this 35 section does not apply to smelts taken in the Androscoggin 36 River above the Merrymeeting Bay bridge, or in Nar37 raguagus Bay or river between the first days of October and 38 November, nor to smelts taken in the Penobscot River and 39 its tributaries between the first and thirtieth days of April, 40 nor to smelts taken in Casco Bay between the fifteenth day of 41 September and the first day of October, nor to smelts taken 42 in Franklin Bay between the first day of April and the first 43 day of May, nor to smelts taken in Little Kennebec Bay, so 44 called, or in Narraguagus Bay or river, in the county of 45 Washington, between the first day of April and the first day 46 of May, nor to smelts taken in West Bay and West Bay 47 stream, so called, in the town of Gouldsboro, Hancock coun-48 ty, between the first day of April and the first day of May, 49 nor to smelts taken in Passamaquoddy Bay, St. Croix River 50 and Cobscook Bay and the coves and inlets tributary to these 51 bays between the first day of September and the first day of 52 October.'
