STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter three hundred and fifty-seven of the Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven entitled "An Act establishing a close time on lobsters in the bays of the towns of Harrington, Milbridge, Steuben and Gouldsboro."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section one of chapter three hundred and fifty-

- 2 seven of the Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven is
- 3 hereby amended by inserting after the word "destroyed" in
- 4 the fourth line of said section, the words 'and five dollars for
- 5 each lobster trap set;' and said section is hereby further
- 6 amended by striking out after the word "thence" in the nine-
- 7 teenth line thereof all the rest of the words in said nineteenth

8 line, and all the words in the twentieth line as far as the 9 word "in," and insert in place thereof the following: 10 'southwesterly on a straight line to the Whistle Buoy of 11 Schoodic Island point, thence northwesterly on a straight 12 line to the southerly point of Big Moose Island, so called, a 13 part of Schoodic peninsula,' so that said section as amended 14 shall read as follows:

'Section I. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy any 16 lobsters between the first day of July and the first day of 17 September in each year under a penalty of one dollar for each 18 lobster so taken, caught, killed or destroyed and five dollars 19 for each lobster trap set in the waters of the towns of Har-20 rington, Milbridge, Steuben and Gouldsboro within the fol-21 lowing points: commencing on the eastern town line of the 22 town of Harrington at the shore running easterly to the 23 spindle on Norton's island ledge, thence westerly to the 24 northern shore of Flint island, thence westerly on a straight 25 line to Seal cove head on the south side of Seal cove and 26 eastern side of Boisbuburt island, thence northerly by the 27 shore of Boisbuburt Island to a line described in the Special 28 Laws of eigheten hundred and ninety-nine, chapter one hun-29 dred and seventy-two, thence northerly on that line to Joe 30 Dyer's point, so called, thence by the shores of Milbridge and 31 Harrington to the place of beginning, also beginning at Bear 32 cove on the western side of Petit Manan point, so called, 33 thence westerly on a straight line to the center of Little 34 Black ledge in the town of Gouldsboro, thence southwesterly 35 on a straight line to the Whistle Buoy off Schoodic Island 36 point, thence northwesterly on a straight line to the souther-37 ly point of Big Moose Island, so called, a part of Schoodic 38 Peninsula, in the town of Winter Harbor, thence northerly 39 by the shore of Schoodic point and by the shores of the towns 40 of Winter Harbor, Gouldsboro and Steuben to the place of 41 beginning.'
