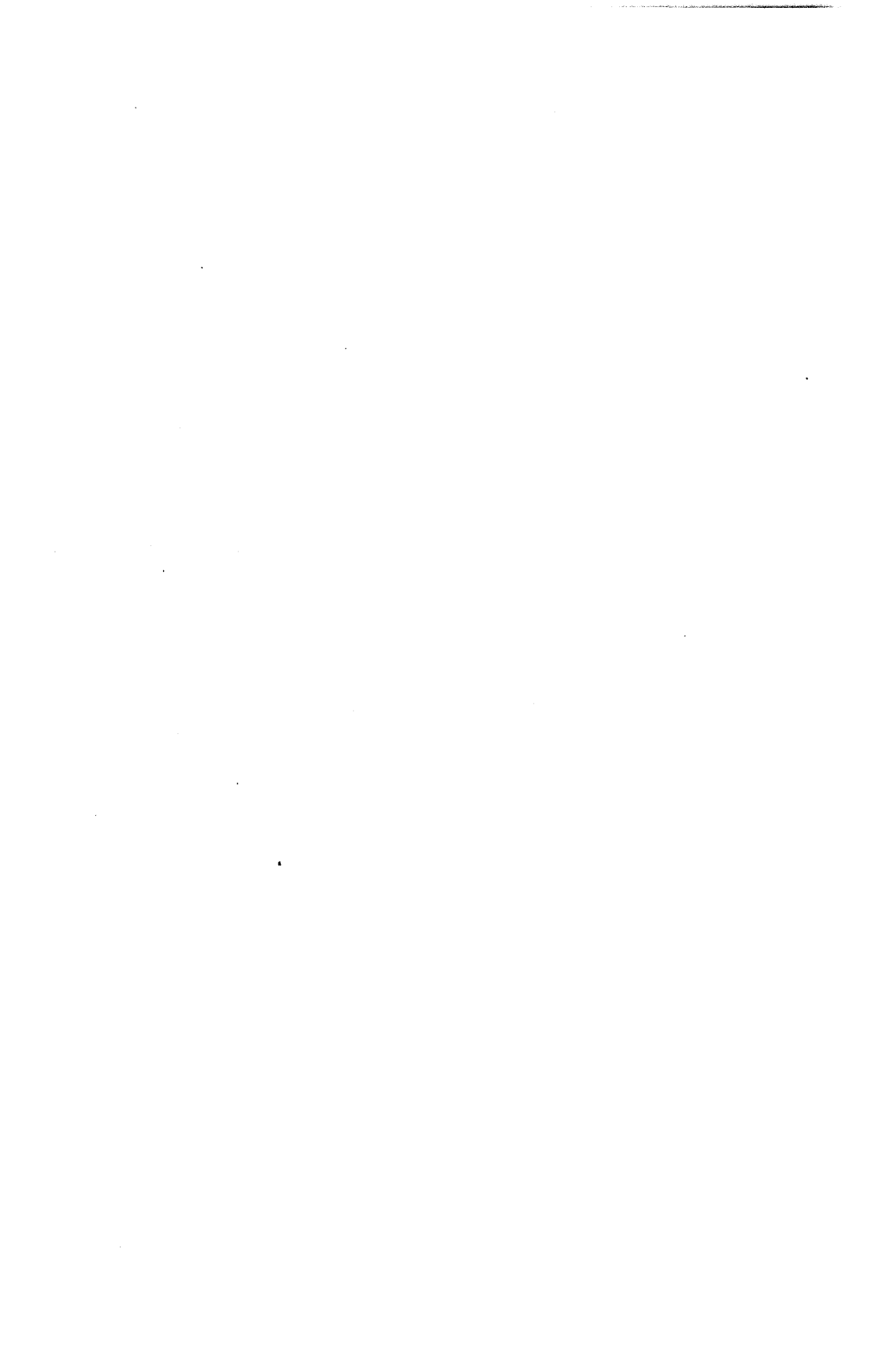
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT relating to life insurance companies doing industrial
business giving special rates of premium to members of
lodges and labor unions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any life insurance company doing business
2 on the industrial plan in this State may issue policies of
3 life or endowment insurance, with or without annuity, with
4 special rates of premiums, less than the usual rates of pre-
5 miums for such policies, to members of labor unions, lodges,
6 beneficial societies or similar organizations, or employees

7 of a single employer who, through their secretary or other
8 officer or employer, may take out insurance in an aggregate
9 of not less than one hundred members and pay their pre-
10 miums through such officer or employer.
