### STATE OF MAINE.

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section thirteen of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirteen of chapter fifteen of the Re-2 vised Statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and 3 eleven of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, 4 is hereby further amended by striking out the word "fifty-5 five" in line six of said section and inserting in place thereof 6 the word 'eighty,' so that said section as amended shall read 7 as follows:

'Sect. 13. Every town shall raise and expend, annually, 9 for the support of common schools therein, exclusive of the 10 income of any corporate school fund, or of any grant from

11 the revenue or fund from the State, or of any voluntary 12 donation, devise or bequest, or of any forfeiture accruing 13 to the use of schools, not less than eighty cents for each 14 inhabitant, according to the census by which representatives 15 to the legislature were last apportioned, under penalty of 16 forfeiting not less than twice nor more than four times the 17 amount of its deficiency, and all moneys provided by towns, 18 or apportioned by the State for the support of common 19 schools, shall be expended for the maintenance of common 20 schools established and controlled by the towns by which 21 said moneys are provided, or to which said moneys are 22 apportioned; but nothing in this section shall be so construed 23 as to annul, or render void, the provisions made in section 24 eighteen of this chapter for the establishing and mainte-25 nance of union schools by adjoining towns.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect January one, nineteen 2 hundred and ten.
