STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in aid of the Maine School for the Deaf.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated for
2 the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of seventeen thou-
3 sand five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
4 nine, and the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dol-
5 lars for the year nineteen hundred and ten, both of said
6 sums for maintenance.

And be it further *Resolved:* That there be and hereby is
8 appropriated for the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of
9 four thousand dollars for equipment of new building for the
10 year nineteen hundred and nine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Maine School for the Deaf is located in the city of Portland. The appropriation of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars for each of the years 1909 and 1910 are the same amounts that were appropriated for 1907 and 1908, and are for maintenance. The appropriation of four thousand dollars for 1909 is for equipment of a new building, for the construction of which the legislature of 1907 made an appropriation.
