STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section 1 of Chapter 24 of the Public Laws of 1907, in relation to reports of hearings in vacation in law or equity.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I of Chapter 24 of the Public Laws of 1907 is 2 hereby amended by adding thereto the following: 'When 3 any such hearing is had before a justice of said court other 4 than one residing in the county where said hearing is held, 5 such justice shall be reimbursed by the State for his ex-6 penses actually and reasonably incurred in attending said 7 hearing, upon presentation to the governor and council of 8 a detailed statement of such expenses,' so that said section 9 I as thus amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. At any hearing in vacation of a cause in law II or equity pending in the supreme judicial court, the pre-12 siding justice may, when necessary, appoint a stenographer 13 other than his regularly appointed court stenographer to 14 report the proceedings thereof who shall receive for his 15 services from the treasury of the county in which the cause 16 is pending a sum not exceeding six dollars a day for attend-17 ance in addition to actual traveling expenses; but when at 18 such hearings the presiding justice employs his regularly 19 appointed stenographer, such stenographer shall receive from 20 said treasury only the amount of his actual expenses incurred 21 in attending the same; when any such hearing is had before 22 a justice of said court other than one residing in the county 23 where said hearing is held, such justice shall be reimbursed 24 by the State for his expenses actually and reasonably in-25 curred in attending said hearing, upon presentation to the 26 governor and council of a detailed statement of such ex-27 penses.'
