STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter eighteen of the Revised Statutes relating to the State Board of Health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section six of chapter eighteen of the revised 2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the first line 3 the word "five," and substituting in the place thereof the 4 word 'six,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as 5 follows:

'Sect. 6. The sum of six thousand dollars shall be annu-7 ally appropriated to pay the salary of the secretary, meet 8 the contingent expenses of the office of the secretary, and 9 the expenses of the board, which shall not exceed the sum 10 appropriated. Said expenses shall be certified and paid in 11 the same manner as the salary of the secretary.'

Sect. 2. Section eight of chapter eighteen of the revised 2 statutes is amended by striking out the words "said diseases 3 into the State" in the twentieth line and inserting in the 4 place thereof the words 'any infectious or contagious dis-5 eases into the State, including rabies, or hydrophobia of 6 animals and men.' Said section is further amended by 7 striking out the words "which regulations shall, so far as 8 may be deemed practicable and safe, be uniform with those 9 which are now in effect in other North American states 1c and provinces;" so that said section, as amended, shall read 11 as follows:

'Sect. 8. The more effectually to protect the public health 13 the State board of health may establish such systems of 14 inspection as in its judgment may be necessary to ascertain 15 the actual or threatened presence of the infection of Asiatic 16 cholera, smallpox, diphtheria, scarlet fever, plague or typhus 17 fever; and any duly authorized agent or inspector of said 18 board may enter any building, vessel, railway car or other 19 public vehicle, to inspect the same and to remove therefrom 20 any person affected by said diseases; and for this purpose 21 he may require the person in charge of any vessel or public 22 vehicle other than a railway car to stop such vessel or 23 vehicle at any place, and he may require the conductor of 24 any railway train to stop his train at any station or upon 25 any side track and there detain it for a reasonable time; 26 provided, that no conductor shall be required to stop his 27 train when telegraphic communication with the despatcher's

28 office cannot be obtained or at such times or under such 29 circumstances as may endanger the safety of the train and 30 passengers; and provided further, that any such agent or 31 inspector may cause any car which he may think may be 32 infected with any of said diseases to be sidetracked at any 33 suitable place and there be cleansed, fumigated and disin-34 fected. And the said board of health may from time to 35 time, make, alter, modify or revoke rules and regulations 36 for guarding against the introduction of any infectious or 37 contagious diseases into the State, including rabies, or hy-38 drophobia of animals and men; for the control and sup-39 pression thereof if within the State; for the quarantine and 40 disinfection of persons, localities and things infected or 41 suspected of being infected by such diseases; for the trans-42 portation of dead bodies when death results from any infec-43 tious or contagious disease; for the speedy and private in-44 terment of the bodies of persons who have died from said 45 diseases; and, in emergency, for providing those sick with 46 said diseases with necessary medical aid and with temporary 47 hospitals for their accommodation and for the accommoda-48 tion of their nurses and attendants. And the said board 49 may declare any and all of its rules and regulations made 50 in accordance with the provisions of this section to be in 51 force within the whole State, or within any specified part 52 thereof, and to apply to any person or persons, family, camp, 53 building, vessel, railway car or public vehicle of any kind."
