STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Maine School for the Deaf.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated to be
2 paid the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of seventeen
3 thousand five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hun-
4 dred nine, and the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred
5 dollars for the year nineteen hundred ten, both said sums for
6 maintenance; also the further sum of twelve thousand dol-
7 lars for the year nineteen hundred nine for the purpose of
8 completing payment on new school building and equipping
9 the school for manual training and other industries.

MEMORANDUM.

For the Maine School for the Deaf amount required for 1909 is \$29,500.

For the Maine School for the Deaf amount required for 1910 is \$17,500.

Maine School for the Deaf established by chapter 446 R. S.

Of the \$29,500 asked for 1909 the sum of \$17,500 is asked as the regular appropriation for maintenance, and \$12,000 to complete payment for a new schoolhouse and to fit up the old schoolhouse for manual training and other industries. The sum of \$20,000 which was appropriated by the last legislature for the erection of a new schoolhouse was insufficient to erect the building, which actually cost \$35,000. Part of the overdraft has been paid out of the regular appropriation for maintenance. If an attempt is made to care for the whole overdraft from the regular appropriation for maintenance the institution will be obliged to exercise economy beyond what it is deemed the State would approve. In order to fit up the industrial department the sum of \$4000 out of the extra \$12,000 asked will be required.

Amount received for New Hampshire pupils in 1908 was \$4050.

Amount expected from New Hampshire pupils for 1909 is \$4500. (20 pupils \$225 each.)

103 pupils now in the school, 83 Maine pupils and 20 from N. H.
