IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section one hundred and twelve of Chapter
fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to Normal Schools and
Training Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one hundred and twelve of Chapter
2 fifteen of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking
3 out all words after the word "tuition" in line five of said
4 section, so that said section, when amended, shall read as
5 follows:

'Sect. 112. Applicants for admission shall be sixteen years
7 of age if females, and seventeen if males, and shall signify
8 their intention to become teachers and come under obligation
9 to teach in this state for at least one year, and if they re-
10 ceive a diploma, two years after they have graduated; on
11 these conditions they shall be received without charge for
12 tuition.'
