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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

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AN ACT to amend Section one hundred and thirteen of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to the duties of the trustees of State Normal Schools.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one hundred and thirteen of Chapter 2 fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter eleven 3 of the Public Laws of 1905 is hereby further amended by 4 striking out the word "employ" in line nine of said section 5 as amended and inserting in place thereof the words "shall 6 employ, upon nomination by the State superintendent of pub- 7 lic schools," so that said section, as amended, shall read as 8 follows:—

'Section 113. Said schools are under the direction of a

10 board of eight trustees, six of whom shall be appointed  
11 by the governor with the advice and consent of the council,  
12 for not more than three years under one appointment; and  
13 the governor and State superintendent of public schools are,  
14 by virtue of their office, members of the board. Said board  
15 has charge of the general interests of said schools; shall see  
16 that the affairs thereof are conducted as required by law and  
17 by such by-laws as the board adopt; shall employ, upon nom-  
18 ination by the State superintendent of public schools, teach-  
19 ers and lecturers for the same; and, annually, on the first  
20 day of December lay before the governor and council, for  
21 the information of the legislature, a financial statement, fur-  
22 nishing an accurate detailed account of the receipts and ex-  
23 penditures for the school year preceding.'
