IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT relative to school outhouses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. It shall be the duty of the superintending school 2 committee to provide at least two suitable and convenient 3 outhouses or water closets for each of the schools under its 4 control. Said outhouses or water closets shall be entirely 5 separated each from the other and shall have separate means 6 of access. Said outhouses and said water closets, if detached 7 from the school house, shall be placed at least thirty feet 8 apart and separated by a substantial close fence not less than 9 seven feet in height and when placed on opposite sides of 10 the school grounds shall be suitably screened from view. 11 The superintending school committee shall have said out-

12 houses and water closets kept in a clean and suitable condi-13 tion. Any town which shall fail to appropriate a sum of 14 money sufficient to enable said superintending school com-15 mittee to comply with the provisions of this act shall be lia-16 ble to a forfeiture of its apportionment of State school funds 17 as provided in Section sixteen of Chapter fifteen.
