STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 10 of Chapter 53 of the Revised Statutes relating to powers of railroad commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 10 of chapter 53 of the Revised Stat-2 utes is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section 3 the words, "unless the same shall be extended as provided 4 in the following section," so that said section as amended 5 shall read as follows:

'Section 10. If any corporation formed under the fore-7 going sections does not within three years after its articles 8 of association are filed, and recorded in the office of the sec9 retary of State, begin the construction of its road and ex-10 pend thereon ten per cent of its capital, its corporate exist-11 ence and power shall cease unless the same shall be extended 12 as provided in the following section.'

Sect. 2. Section 11 of chapter 53 of the Revised Statutes 2 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

'Section 11. The board of railroad commissioners may 4 extend the corporate existence and powers of such corpora-5 tion for a period not exceeding three years or may revive 6 such corporate existence and powers for a like period after 7 the same shall have ceased as provided in the preceding sec-8 tion. Said commissioners, if they deem it expedient, and if o the same be prayed for, may include in such extension any 10 rights or powers granted to such corporation by special law, II and in such case all rights and powers of such corporation, 12 whether existing under this chapter or under any special 13 law, shall continue in full force for the period not exceeding 14 three years determined by the commissioners. Provided, 15 however, that before decreeing such extension or revival, no-16 tice shall be given and hearing had as provided by section 7 17 of said chapter 53.'
