STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Phippsburg.

Resolved: That there be paid the town of Phippsburg the
2 sum of ninety-eight dollars, it being the amount due said
3 town for tuition of pupils in secondary schools for the years
4 nineteen hundred four, nineteen hundred five, nineteen hun-
5 dred six and nineteen hundred seven but not reported by that
6 town until recently.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve is for the reimbursement of the town of Phippsburg for the tuition of pupils in secondary schools under the provision of sections 63 and 64 of Chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes.

The town of Phippsburg paid out by certified returns now on file at the office of the State Supt. of Schools,

the total sum of one hundred ninety-six dollars for the school years ending July 1, 1904, July 1, 1905, July 1, 1906, and July 1, 1907.

This entitles the town of Phippsburg under the provisions of the above named sections to the sum of ninety-eight dollars. Owing to the inability of the State Auditor to draw a warrant against the free high school appropriation, for the years 1904, 1905, 1906 and 1907 this method was taken as the most simple to secure a sum properly due from the State to the town of Phippsburg.
