STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred and seventy-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven relating to the State Superintendent of Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of Chapter one hundred and seven 2 enty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven 3 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "purpose" in 4 line five of said section the words "he shall employ a clerk, 5 who may serve as his deputy, at a salary not to exceed fifteen 6 hundred dollars annually, with necessary expenses when on 7 official business within the State, and other clerical assistance at a cost not to exceed one thousand dollars annually," 9 so that said section, when amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The salary of the State superintendent of II schools is hereby established at twenty-five hundred dollars He shall receive in addition his actual cash 12 per annum. 13 expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties 14 which sum shall be paid out of the specific appropriation for 15 that purpose. He shall employ a clerk, who may serve as 16 his deputy, at a salary not to exceed fifteen hundred dollars 17 annually, with necessary expenses when on official business 18 within the State, and other clerical assistance at a cost not to 19 exceed one thousand dollars annually. He shall perform 20 his official duties at the office provided for him at the seat of 21 government and not elsewhere, not meaning, however, to 22 prohibit him from making such necessary journeys and per-23 forming such duties as are necessary or incidental to the 24 immediate object of such journey.

Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act, are hereby repealed.
