STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the Maine State Prison.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum
2 of fifteen thousand dollars for a fire proof building at the
3 Maine State Prison to be used as a harness shop and car-
4 riage repository.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The present building used for harness shop and carriage repository is a frail, wooden building that is ill adapted in almost every particular for the work that is being done. It is absolutely without fire protection. There is at times property value amounting to fifty or sixty thousand dollars in new materials and manufactured products, and at all times from twenty-five to forty thousand dollars. It is not considered good judgment by the inspectors and the committee from the Governor's Council for the State to carry this risk. We feel it absolutely necessary that the present building be replaced by a fire proof brick building.
