STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section twenty of Chapter four hundred and thirty-six of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, entitled "An Act to establish the Milo Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty of Chapter four hundred and
2 thirty-six of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hun-
3 dred and seven is hereby amended by substituting the word
4 "shall" for the word "may" in the first line of said section,
5 and by striking out all of said section after the word "pre-
6 vail" in the eleventh line of said section, and inserting in its
7 place the words, "An accurate account of the fees so received

8 by said judge shall be by him laid before the county com-
9 missioners of Piscataquis, and he shall pay the same into
10 the county treasury of said county quarterly on or before the
11 first days of January, April, July and October of each year.
12 The judge of said court shall receive a salary of five hun-
13 dred dollars per year, to be paid him in quarterly payments
14 from the county treasury of Piscataquis County, which shall
15 be in full for his services as such judge. When the office
16 of judge is vacant the recorder shall be entitled to the same
17 fees received by said judge, the fees of said recorder to be
18 paid by the judge.” So that said section, as amended, shall
19 read as follows:

‘Section 20. The judge of said court shall demand and
21 receive the same fees allowed by law to trial justices and
22 clerks of the supreme judicial court for similar services, ex-
23 cept that he shall receive for every blank writ signed by him,
24 three cents; for the entry of civil action, fifty cents; for each
25 warrant issued by him, one dollar; for the trial of an issue
26 in civil or criminal cases, one dollar for the first day and two
27 dollars for each subsequent day actually employed; and said
28 fees for the trial of an issue in civil actions shall be paid by
29 the plaintiff before proceeding with the trial each day, to be
30 taxed in his costs, if he prevail. An accurate account of the
31 fees so received by said judge shall be by him laid before the
32 county commissioners of Piscataquis county, and he shall
33 pay the same into the county treasury of said county quar-
34 terly on or before the first days of January, April, July and

35 October of each year. The judge of said court shall receive
36 a salary of five hundred dollars per year, to be paid him in
37 quarterly payments from the county treasury of Piscataquis
38 county, which shall be in full for his services as such judge.
39 When the office of judge is vacant the recorder shall be en-
40 titled to the same fees received by said judge, the fees of
41 said recorder to be paid by the judge.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with this sec-
2 tion are hereby repealed.
