STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of a highway bridge over St. John River,
between Van Buren and St. Leonards, N. B.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated, one-half in the year 1909, and one-half in the year 1910, to meet not to exceed one-half the cost of constructing a highway bridge over the St. John River, between the town of Van Buren, Aroostook County, and the village of St. Leonards, Madawaska County, N. B.

PROVIDED, that the expenditure of this amount shall not be made unless the Dominion of Canada or the Province of New Brunswick furnish and expend an amount sufficient to meet one-half the cost of construction of said bridge.

Said bridge shall be built of steel or iron of sufficient width to accommodate traffic, upon substantial piers and abutments of masonry.

Said appropriation shall be expended under the direction
16 of the State Commissioner of Highways, acting in concert
17 with such person or persons as may be designated by the
18 Dominion of Canada or the Province of New Brunswick.
