### STATE OF MAINE.

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section sixteen of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Section I. Section sixteen of chapter fifteen of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out after the 3 the word "to" in line three of said section the words "exam-4 ine teachers as prescribed" and inserting in place thereof 5 the words "employ teachers certificated as required" and by 6 adding after the word "law" in line nine of said section the 7 words "and that it has complied in all ways with the laws 8 prescribing the duties of towns in relation to public schools," 9 so that said section, when amended shall read as follows:

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'Section 16. When the governor and council have reason 11 to believe that a town has neglected to raise and expend the 12 school money required by law, or to employ teachers certifi-13 cated as required by law, or to have instruction given in the 14 subjects prescribed by law, or to provide suitable text-books 15 in the subjects prescribed by law, or faithfully to expend 16 the school money received from the State or in any way, to 17 comply with the law prescribing the duties of towns in rela-18 tion to public schools, they shall direct the treasurer of State 19 to withhold further payment to such town from the State 20 school fund and mill tax until such town satisfies them 21 that it has expended the full amount of school money 22 as required by law and that it has complied in all ways with 23 the law prescribing the duties of towns in relation to public 24 schools.'
