STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of gov-
ernment for the year one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whereas, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance of the several branches of the State government and its institutions is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore,

Section 1. In order to provide for the several Acts and
2 Resolves of the Legislature requiring the payment of money
3 from the State Treasury, and also to provide in part for the
4 necessary expenditures of government, for the current fiscal

5 year one thousand nine hundred and nine, the following
 6 sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the
 7 State Treasury, and, except where otherwise specially pro-
 8 vided, the Governor with the advice and consent of the
 9 Council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first
 10 day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, to
 11 draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for the same.
