IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT authorizing towns and cities to elect fish wardens
in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any city, town or plantation in which there is
2 a lake or a pond that has been stocked with fish by the State
3 and screened partly by the State and partly by the town or
4 by private subscription, may, at its annual election, elect a
5 fish warden, with all the powers of other fish wardens, whose
6 duty it shall be to care for and protect said screen.
