STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Ray P. Eaton.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand eight hundred
2 and nine dollars and ninety cents be paid to Ray P. Eaton,
3 being the amount of his official fees, including disburse-
4 ments for clerk hire, in excess of his salary and allowance
5 as register of deeds for the county of Cumberland from
6 the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and five,
7 to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hun-
8 dred and six.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Ray P. Eaton was elected Register of Deeds of Cumberland County in 1902 for the term of four years from January 1, 1903. By political custom no Register of Deeds of Cumberland County is re-elected. Mr. Eaton expected to receive, during the term for which he had been elected, the full emoluments of the office as fixed by law at the time of his election. The amount of the emoluments of his office were decreased by act of the Legislature in 1905 and taking effect on July 1, 1905, to the amount stated in the resolve. During the eighteen months from July 1, 1905, to December 31, 1906, Mr. Eaton paid from his own salary for clerical assistance nine hundred and eighty-nine dollars and twelve cents (\$989.12), the allowance provided by the act of 1905 being insufficient for that purpose.
