## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section ten (10) of chapter fifty-seven (57) of the Revised Statutes of Maine (1903), relating to the establishment and support of Free Public Libraries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section ten of chapter fifty-seven of the Re-

- 2 vised Statutes of this State is hereby amended by striking
- 3 out from the sixth line thereof the word "one dollar," and
- 4 inserting in place thereof the words 'two dollars,' so that
- 5 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 10. Any town may establish a free public library

- 7 therein, for the use of its inhabitants, and provide suitable
- 8 rooms therefor, under such regulation for its government

9 as the inhabitants from time to time prescribe; and may 10 appropriate, for the foundation and commencement of such 11 library, a sum not exceeding two dollars, and for its main-12 tenance and increase annually a sum not exceeding two 13 dollars, for each of its ratable polls in the year next pre-14 ceding. Any town in which there is a free public library 15 may establish and maintain under the same general manage-16 ment and control, such branches of the same as the con-17 venience and wants of its citizens seem to demand.'
