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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

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AN ACT to provide for a bounty on wild cats.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section 14 of chapter 32 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "town" in the first line of said section the words "and two dollars for every wild cat killed in the State" and by inserting after the word "peace" in the forty-fourth line of said section the following words:
