IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to provide for a bounty on wild cats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 14 of chapter 32 of the revised stat-2 utes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "town" 3 in the first line of said section the words "and two dollars 4 for every wild cat killed in the State" and by inserting after 5 the word "peace" in the forty-fourth line of said section the 6 following words: "Claimant's Certificate for bounty on wild cat.

To the Treasurer of I hereby certify that on the 9 day of A. D. 19. at in the State of 10 Maine, I killed the wildcat the skin of which I now exhibit 11 to you; and I claim the bounty allowed by law for killing 12 the same.
