STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT in amendment of section one of chapter one hundred and thirty-six of the Revised Statutes relating to sentence in criminal cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and thirty2 six of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking
3 out all that part of said section beginning with the word
4 "when" in the fifth line of said section and ending with
5 the word "both" in the seventh line of said section, so that
6 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section I. No person shall be punished for an offense 8 until convicted thereof in a court having jurisdiction of 9 the person and case. When no punishment is provided by

10 statute, a person convicted of an offense shall be impris-11 oned for less than one year or fined not exceeding five 12 hundred dollars. In all cases where a fine is imposed he 13 may be sentenced to pay the costs of prosecution; and for 14 violations of sections forty-one, forty-two, forty-four, forty-15 nine and fifty-four of chapter twenty-nine, he shall be 16 sentenced to pay such costs.'
