STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Cumberland County to create a Sinking Fund for the purpose of paying the bonded debt of said county.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The county commissioners of the county of
2 Cumberland are hereby authorized to create a sinking fund,
3 for the purpose of paying the bonded debt of said county.

Sect. 2. Such sums as shall be raised or appropriated for
2 that purpose, shall be safely invested by the commissioners
3 of said county, upon a two-thirds vote of said county com-
4 missioners and the senators and representatives to the legis-
5 lature from said county present at a meeting called by said
6 commissioners for that purpose; and such sums shall be

7 reinvested, as occasion may require, in the name of said
8 county, and in the manner herein provided, until required
9 to be used in the payment of said bonded indebtedness of
10 said county.

Sect. 3. The meetings provided for in section two of this
2 act, shall be called by the county commissioners, by a letter
3 addressed by them to each member of the legislature from
4 said county, naming the date, place and object of the
5 meeting.

Sect. 4. Senators and representatives attending any meet-
2 ing called under the provisions of section three of this act,
3 shall be paid from the county treasury of said county actual
4 expenses of attendance on said meetings, upon an order
5 drawn by the county commissioners.
