IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT in relation to exceptions and appeal in criminal cases.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section twenty-seven of chapter one hundred  
2 and thirty-five of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended  
3 by adding at the end thereof the following words:

‘But in all other criminal cases amounting to a felony,  
5 where like motion is filed and appeal taken to the law court  
6 the concurrence of a majority of the justices shall be neces-  
7 sary to grant such motion and no sentence shall be imposed  
8 until after final judgment.’
