IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Union Cemetery Improvement
Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

11 E. Stewart, all of Union, in the county of Knox and State
12 of Maine, and Chester M. Walker, Lucy E. Barton, Calvin
13 Barrows and Charles E. Barnard, all of Rockland, in the
14 county of Knox and State of Maine, their associates, suc-
15 cessors and assigns, are hereby incorporated by the name
16 of the Union Cemetery Improvement Company, for the pur-
17 pose of caring for, beautifying and keeping in order gen-
18 erally, the cemetery situated in the town of Union afore-
19 said, a short distance from Union common and generally
20 known as the Union Cemetery.

Sect. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to receive
2 from any person, corporation or other source, money or
3 property and to hold and use the income from any such
4 property for the purposes set forth in section one of this
5 act, and no more. Said company is hereby authorized to
6 make such by-laws as are necessary to carry out the pro-
7 visions of this act. The first meeting of said company may
8 be called by a notice thereof, signed by any five of the cor-
9 porators herein named and served upon each corporator by
10 publishing the same for three consecutive weeks in some
11 newspaper printed in said county of Knox, the last pub-
12 lication to be at least seven days before the time of meeting.

Sect. 3. This act shall become null and void in two years
2 from the time when the same takes effect, unless the cor-
3 poration shall have been organized under this charter.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
