STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Muddy Pond, so called, in the
town of Washington, county of Knox.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Muddy Pond, so called,
3 in the town of Washington, and county of Knox, for a
4 period of three years from July 1st, 1909.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provisions of this act shall
2 be liable to the same penalty as is provided in the general
3 law of the State for illegal fishing for and catching trout
4 and landlocked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this chapter, municipal
2 and police judges and trial justices within their respective
3 counties shall have upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts,
5 and all fines, forfeitures, and penalties received for any vio-
6 lation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person re-
7 ceiving the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to
8 fines and license fees for the protection of birds and game.
